On Sunday, October 29, 2017, One Care of Southwest Virginia, Inc. is joining forces with the Virginia Department of Health to offer a **free forum that will provide health care providers with knowledge and skills to apply in clinical practice regarding prescribing controlled substances.**

Target Audience: Practicing/licensed MDs/DOs, APNs, PAs, Nurses, Pharmacists, and Medical or Nursing Students in the Commonwealth.

Overall Objectives:

- Incorporate overdose prevention education and Naloxone rescue kits into medical and pharmacy practice by educating patients about overdose risk reduction and furnishing Naloxone rescue kits.
- Evaluate current scientific approaches to the diagnosis and treatment of substance use disorders.
- Describe licensing boards' required approaches to pain management.
- Compare options available for treatment of opioid use disorders (i.e., methadone maintenance therapy, buprenorphine, naltrexone).
- Apply Virginia Board of Medicine emergency regulations on prescribing of opioids or buprenorphine to common clinical case scenarios.
- Interpret prescription drug monitoring reports as a routine practice in patient-centered care.
